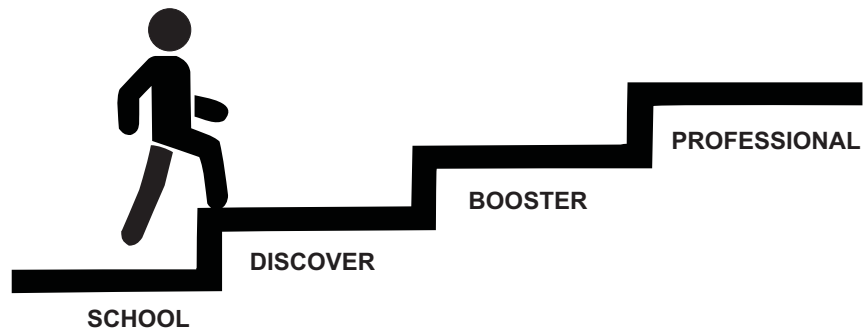

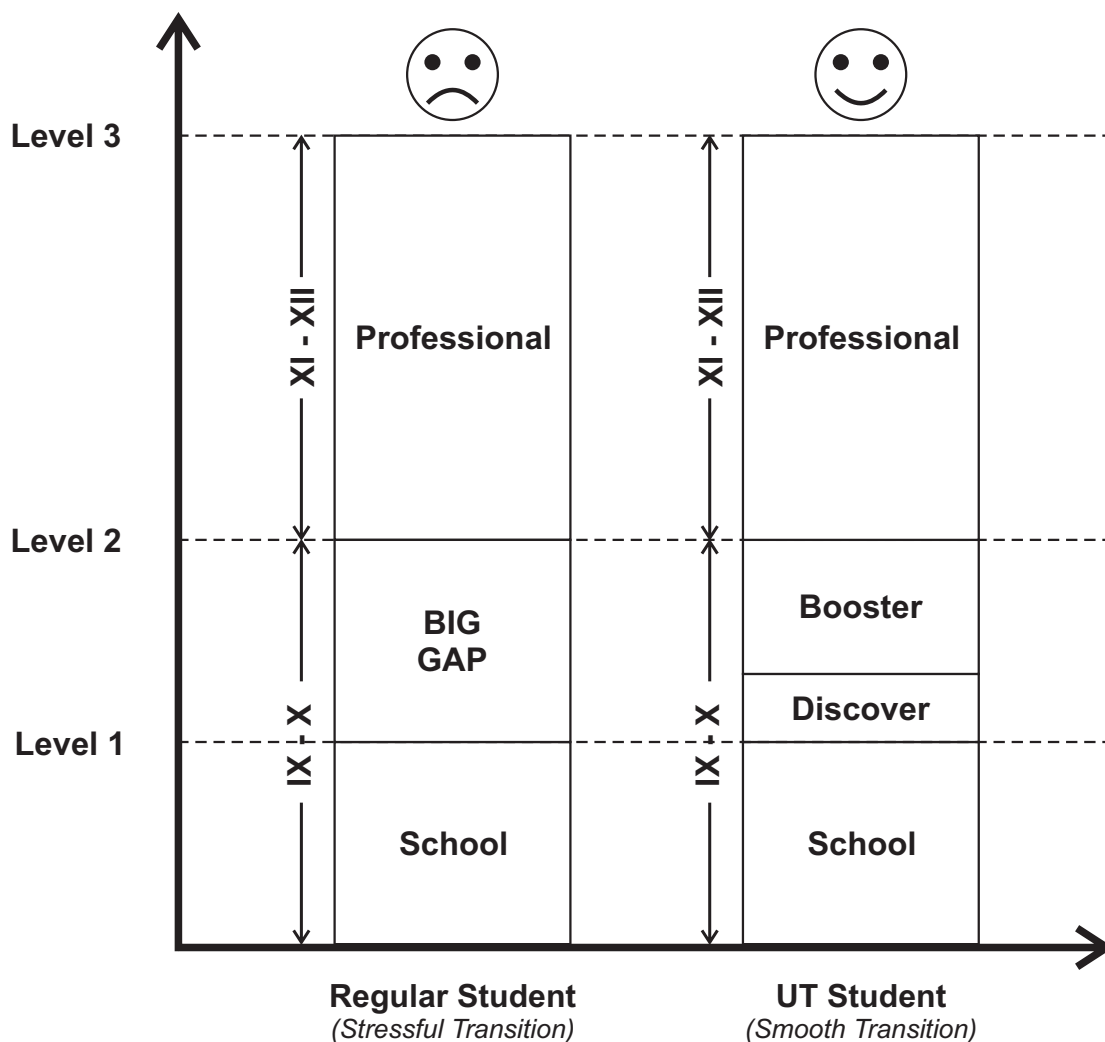

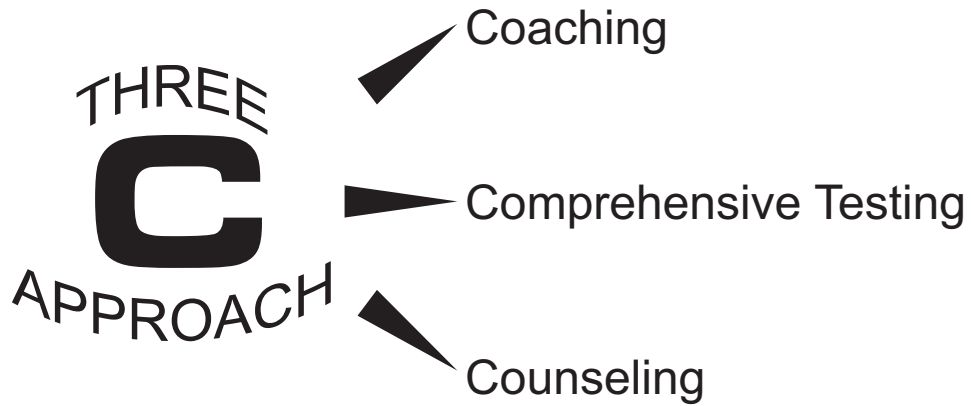

Student Assessment Process



Student assessment involves data collection from accepted analysis methods in order to monitor, draw conclusions, make recommendations and improve student learning.

● Data collection

1. **Academic Performance** from tests conducted at UT subject-wise.
2. **Discipline** (Misbehaviour and irresponsible attitude) from Professors who teach them and branch coordinators.
3. **Test and Lecture Attendance** from our automated computerized system.
4. **Parent's Inputs** with respect to their child's performance.

● Data Analysis

1. **Categorizing the Students:** The students are categorized based on average percentage marks obtained in individual subject. This is to ensure that each student will be helped in different ways to help improve their performance in each subject.

- ◆ Weak Below 50%
- ◆ Average 51% - 80%
- ◆ Topper Above 80%

The cut-off for topper category is slightly on lower side, considering that the students may not be able to perform 100% in the initial tests of particular subject due to lack of preparation (for those students who try to prepare sincerely for tests) in a restricted time. So we expect even if the student scores 80% and above marks, he/she is able to explore much better in their school exams.

2. **Student's Progress** in every subject is tracked test-wise.

For example, marks obtained in Maths by a student

- ◆ Test 1 48% Weak
- ◆ Test 2 81% Topper
- ◆ Test 3 74% Above Average

This comparative analysis helps us to understand whether student's performance is improving or deteriorating.

3. **Student's Absenteeism** in tests and lectures is monitored and analyzed.

● Communication

Parents will receive following communication regarding their ward's performance.

1. **Test:** After every UT test, parents will receive,
 - ◆ **Test Performance Report (System Generated):** This report gives you various test statistics like the test high, average, low, your ward's city percentile, top 3 students in the test, etc.
 - ◆ **Performance Analysis Letter** from counselor which will reflect student's current performance in each subject, student's progress test-wise, counselor's view about student's performance, corrective recommendations and counseling appointment details, if necessary.
2. **Lecture Attendance Report** all students.
3. **Test absenteeism Letter** for students with more than 50% absenteeism.
4. **Absenteeism Analysis Letter** for irregular students.



● Corrective steps

We at UT expect that there should be minimum 20-30% increase in marks in each subject after joining us. (subject to the condition that the child attends at-least 90% of the program and appears for the tests with sincere efforts).

1. Students scoring below 50% in a subject are,

- ◆ Called for personal meeting with counselor to discuss their problem areas.
- ◆ These students are motivated to perform to their best potential. UT provides all necessary support to help student improve.
- ◆ The improvement status is observed in retests and next regular tests.

2. Students scoring between 51% to 80% are provided

- ◆ Help through counseling (if required)
- ◆ Personal guidance from subject teacher,
- ◆ Doubt solving sessions and individual help sessions to help them improve their scores in weak subjects.

3. Students scoring above 80% will be provided

- ◆ Subject related help from subject teachers during toppers session and individual help sessions.

4. No response from parents,

- ◆ Counselor will not be able to assess their ward's performance.
- ◆ Thus cannot provide any help for his/her improvement.
- ◆ Such students may be temporarily suspended.

● UT's Limitations

UT's Philosophy "*We help students who help themselves*"

We are always open to support our students however following being our limitations.

1. Student is not willing to make any effort.
2. Parents are not responding to any communication done by UT to them.
3. Students don't appear for UT tests and retests regularly and thus can't be assessed.
4. Students miss the lectures intentionally and thus can't understand topic being taught in previous and next lectures.
5. In extreme cases UT may ask students to quit UT who do not cooperate on our efforts to help them.

FREQUENTLY ASK QUESTIONS



General Queries

- **Will joining in all the subjects in the regular classroom program make it stressful for the student?**

Historically, 81% of our students join for all subjects, the remaining join as per their needs. As UT takes adequate care in adjusting with the school schedule, it is not stressful. Infact, students also get extra guidance required for the subjects during the session at UT.

- **Can I attend some lectures in one branch and some in other?**

No, the programs vary from branch to branch.

- **How do I manage both school and UT (CBSE & ICSE)?**

We at UT consider ourselves as an 'Academic Reinforcement Agency' to school. Schools are the basic education provider. Having said this you will appreciate the basic philosophy of our program 'Read before going to Class'.

We at UT understand and appreciate student's priorities at school. Keeping the same in mind, we have designed the program in such a way that in the earlier months from March to June, we complete nearly 70% of the portion. In these months the school load is relatively less heavy.

We have designed the program in such a way that we complete the full portion by the end of October and start conducting full portion tests of all the subjects from November to February.

- **My friend studies at Nerul branch and I study at the Vashi branch, will we be coached by different professors?**

UT is a system driven institute. All professors at UT are well trained, experienced in Board coaching and have been following the UT systems. While many subjects across branches have common professors, some subjects across branches are being taught by different professors given the subject / topic expertise and rotation policy of UT systems to ensure high quality of academic inputs.

- **Do I get any notes at UT?**

Yes, you get exhaustive printed notes in every subject that comprehensively covers the entire syllabus.

- **Will I be given home work at UT?**

Yes, there are pre-designed practice weekly assignment.

- **Which books do I need to buy or study from for the UT program?**

You need only the NCERT / School text books and our UT volumes for the entire UT program. We do not recommend any additional reference books. UT volumes are exhaustive. You need to create separate note books for each subject to copy down CW and HW notes.

- **What study material should I carry to UT for the classes?**

You are required to make individual registers for individual professors. Both CW and HW are to be done in the same register for that professor. You are required to carry UT volumes, NCERT/ School text books and professor wise registers as per daily timetable.

- **What happens if I come to the lecture without completing my homework?**

The student will be asked to stay back after the class hours and complete the home-work. He/ she may be in-addition asked to remain standing during the said lecture in which the home-work was due.

- **Can I change my batch/ branch at UT?**

Ideally no, but if it is unavoidable you are recommended to meet our student counselor. He will take a decision on a case to case basis ensuring that minimum loss is incurred due to different portions being taught at different branches/ batches.



CBSE Queries

- **What is the new pattern of CBSE exams?**

Government has introduced CBSE board exams with full year syllabus from academic year 2017-18.

This board exams will carry 80% of the total marks and only 20% marks will be internal which will include periodic tests, practical, attendance, etc.

Full year syllabus will be asked for the final board exam.

- **What are the challenges to prepare for board exam?**

Students have to prepare full year syllabus for the board exam.

Board exam will be conducted once at the end of the year and therefore students will get only one chance to show their performance.

- **What is the advantage of joining UT from std. IX onwards?**

It is imperative that you need to perform well right from std. IX onwards. Thus, UT provides the required guidance from std. IX onwards in a very structured way.

- **What are the advantages of joining UT to prepare for board exams?**

UT is preparing students for CBSE board exams since 1998 and have produced excellent results throughout last 27 years.

UT has ample experience in coaching students in both semester and yearly patterns.

UT is the only well organized coaching center in Navi Mumbai with experienced teaching team and its effective Test Series Program.

- **Will CBSE have 2 board exams?**

The Central Board for Secondary Examination (CBSE) has implemented two board exams for Class 10. The new system is in place from 2026, meaning that from 2026 onwards, a Class 10 student will have the option to appear again in maximum 3 subjects in second phase in May, first phase in February is mandatory for all. The first phase in February and the second in May.

ICSE Queries

- **What is the advantage of joining UT from std. IX onwards?**

In order to excel in the board exams, students need to have an indepth knowledge and strong conceptual understanding in the major subjects from std. IX onwards. UT provides the required guidance in a very structured way from std. IX onwards.

- **I have heard that syllabus is taught at a very fast pace in the regular classroom program, is it true?**

False, as a matter of fact our teachers spend probably slightly greater number of hours than that recommended by the ICSE Board. It is felt this way primarily because our lectures are more efficient.

Entrance Exam Preparation

- **Does Universal also provide professional guidance for choosing higher programs?**

Yes. UT conducts a career counseling seminar in the third week of March every year. An Aptitude Test is held before the seminar which helps the student to determine which field of study is best suited for them.

- **What are the courses offered by UT for Entrance preparation?**

There are various courses offered by UT to prepare students for entrance exams like JEE Main, Adv., BIT-SAT, MH-CET, SAT, CLAT, IPM, etc.

- **What is UT-StudyBuzz Program?**

UT-StudyBuzz is a joint collaboration in which synergies of two leading institutes, UT (leader in board preparation) and StudyBuzz (leader in entrance exam), are utilized for preparing students for the Boards as well as the Entrance exam like JEE Main, Adv., BIT-SAT, MH-CET and NEET.

- **How does UT-StudyBuzz prepare the students to face the challenges of the Entrance Exams?**

The StudyBuzz faculty prepares the students for the basic syllabus of both Boards and Entrance exam. UT then provides them with Board testing support in form of mock full pattern board pattern tests from Nov. to Feb. in Std. XII.

- **What is the procedures for admission?**

The student has to appear for an aptitude test at any of any of our five branches. Student can appear for the test on any Sunday, with prior appointment.



Test and Test Time Table Queries

- **How are the tests planned for CBSE / ICSE board?**
In order to help students prepare for their exams throughout their academic session, we at UT have planned various types of tests. These tests are as follows:
 - ◆ **Chapter Tests:** These are chapter wise tests. These tests are also offered to test series students. These tests are spread throughout the year. Flexibility is available to appear for class tests based on the portion completed in the schools.
 - ◆ **Periodic Tests:** Here multiple chapters are clubbed together. This is to slowly prepare the student for full portion test later on.
 - ◆ **Mock Tests:** These are full portion tests conducted annually / semester wise as per the respective board pattern.
- **How will I come to know about the test time-table and the portion for the tests?**
Refer to the branch notice-board and/ or refer to the UT website for the Test Time-table.
- **Where are the tests held and where do I sit during the tests?**
Before every test, a test classroom arrangement is displayed on every respective branch notice-board. Refer to the same for this information.
- **Who will correct my test papers at UT?**
All test answer papers are corrected at UT central premises at Kharghar by the same teachers teaching you. We at UT do not have a separate team of tutors correcting the papers. This ensures better quality of paper correction.
- **When are the corrected papers given back?**
All test papers at UT are corrected within 5-7 working days.
- **How do I come to know the right answers of the questions asked in the tests at UT?**
We at UT provide printed model answer papers for each test held at UT immediately after the test.
- **I have misplaced my copy of the question paper/ model answer of a test. Can I get a duplicate copy?**
There are 2 ways of getting the same:
 - i) either collect the same from your respective branch coordinator, or
 - ii) download a copy of the same from the UT website.

Class Discipline Queries

- **What is the discipline procedure at UT?**
UT has a two step discipline procedure. If a student is found resorting to any unfair/ misconduct in class he/ she will be issued a Yellow card which will consist of a formal warning to the student and information to the parents.
Any repeat offence will lead to issuance of a Red card that will entail a suspension of 3 days for the student from UT classes. The decision of the teacher/ management will be final in this regard.
- **Am I allowed to carry a mobile in the class/ test?**
No, you are not allowed to carry a mobile phone into the classroom at any point of time. You can use the UT phones in case of any emergency.
- **What is the importance of the Identity Card?**
The Identity Card is an important document not only for the students but also for the UT Staff. From the Identity Card we are able to know which courses and subjects you have enrolled for. This card has to be compulsorily brought by the student whenever he/she comes to UT. Without this card students are not allowed to sit for lectures / Tests or enter UT premises.
- **Can I come late for the lectures?**
Ideally no, but if it is a genuine reason, with due parent permission (written application, duly signed by the parent), respective branch coordinators may allow the student to sit in the next subsequent lectures of the day. The student will be marked 'Late' for the lecture. A student can have a maximum of 3 'Late' lectures during an entire year.



Absenteeism Queries

- How is the lecture / test attendance recorded at UT?**
 At UT we have attendance recording for every lecture and test. Thus, if in a day there are 2 lectures, the student has to sign on 2 different lists for each of the 2 lectures during the day. In case of any absenteeism the respective branch coordinator will send out SMS or call the parents informing them of the same.
- What is the absent procedure at UT? Whom do I inform and how?**
 Ideally no absenteeism is allowed during the program. In case of unavoidable situations, you need to inform the respective branch coordinator through a written leave application, signed by the parents. No verbal communication or phone calls will be entertained.
- If I remained absent for lectures will the missed out portion be covered again?**
 Yes, in case of genuine reasons only. Contact the Student Counselor for the same.
- If I am absent for a lecture, can I attend the afternoon batch instead of the morning batch?**
 Absolutely not, because the portions proceeding in both the batches may not be the same. For the missed portions you are requested to contact the branch coordinator.
- What happens if I remain absent for a test? Or What is the procedure for Late attempt test at UT? Or If there is a test at school can I miss the UT program?**
 You can apply for a 'Late Attempt' with due parent permission (written application, duly signed by the parent). You need to get in touch with our respective branch coordinator who will conduct the test at a later date and time. A student can write a maximum of 3 'Late Attempts' during an entire year.
- What is UT's late attempt test policy?**
 Student can appear for missed tests within 7 days after the date of scheduled test. Student need to fix their late attempt test schedule after discussion with branch coordinator.
- Can I appear for test earlier then scheduled date?**
 No. It will not be allowed under any circumstances.
